



Letter from CEO

Letter from Dr Christine Cole Shelter Veterinarian and CEO

This year we proudly reunited 62% of dogs with their owners, found new homes for 25% of our arrivals transferred 2% to specialist rescue to find their new homes

The reclaim rate for cats remains extremely low, at just 3%. This is normal across the industry and points to greater work required in the space of responsible cat ownership within our community

46% of our feline friends found new homes after arriving at our shelter, including 13% who were adopted through our Adoption Partners, an initiative where we partner with pet supply stores and a book store who follow our responsible rehoming methods to rehome cats, kittens and pocket pets. We're excited to be leading the way in this space.

With low numbers of animals coming from our council areas and our average adoption wait time on shelter being just 3 weeks, we have used this opportunity to assist animals from more crowded shelters (particularly the RSPCA) and taken on some of their more challenging animals for rehoming.

This year we de-sexed 245 dogs and 576 cats. Provided medical and surgical procedures to countless animals to prepare them for adoption including dental care, fracture repairs, cruciate surgery, care-surgeries, x-rays, eye removals and some faily fancy surgeries to salayed goos with end stage age and see plastic surgery to address congenital respiratory and eye issues, and one cat with a malformed ribcage

We have also provided vet care to animals in urgent need whose owners were unable to afford full fee vet care. This welfare work enabled these animals to stay with loving owners, including restoring to health the beloved dog of a homeless person living in a car. Growing our welfare arm is a key priority as we move

Being Sydney's only not-for-profit pound that doesn't place time limits and with our need to relocate our entire operation we know the challenge ahead for us is large, but the animals of Sydney need us. Our services and community programs are as unique as they are vital, and we look forward to servicing more areas of Sydney as further cement ourselves as Sydney's leading, Not-For-Profit animal and community




