FOSTER RULES - Keeping your foster animal safe

(Chat with the Foster Manger for more info)

- Do not alter or stop any medications unless approved by a SDCH vet.
- Do **not** give your animal to another person unless approved by the Foster Manager.

Dogs

- No Dog Parks
- No off-leash time when out of the home
- No walks for the first 3 days

Cats

- Not allow outside
- Do not feed cow's milk



Rabbits

- Provide food at all times
- No free roaming outside

BRINGING A FOSTER ANIMAL HOME

For many animals, changing environments can be scary and overwhelming. So, remember Less is More when it comes to foster caring.

Set your home up so it is quiet and calm, with not too much activity.

Avoid having visitors and going on trips for the first week.

PROMOTE YOUR FOSTER ANIMAL

THE ADOPTION PROCESS

Once an animal has had their vet work completed, the SDCH team will work on making the animal available for adoption.

SYDNEY DOGS & CATS HOME FOSTER CARER GUIDE

When we receive an adoption enquiry, the Animal Care Team will check the applicant based on your feedback. We may also ask you to contact the adopter, to relay more in-depth information about your foster animal.

If all goes well, we will then organise an adoption meet & greet at our shelter.

If a foster carer decides they want to adopt, simply let your Foster Manager or your foster mentor know *ASAP*. We will then put a note on the animal's file so that the Animal Care Team can get in contact to process your adoption.

RETURNING AN ANIMAL

You must call SDCH before returning an animal. We will need to reserve a kennel or cage for the animal and make sure we have staff available.

AFTER HOURS STICKY SITUATIONS (BEFORE 8:00AM OR AFTER 4:00PM)

In the unlikely situation that it is after hours and you get 'stuck', remember to keep calm and take a minute to process the situation.

"My foster animal got out or is lost"

- Search your entire house including cupboards and small places (cats in particular, can squeeze into very small spaces).
- Call your local vets.
- Knock on your neighbours' doors.
- Go for a search.
- SMS the foster mobile (0418 589 886) so the Foster Manager finds your message first thing in the morning.
- At 9:00am you can also call Sydney Dogs & Cats Home.

"I am not comfortable around my foster animal"

Set up a secure, separate room (eg. spare room, toilet, bathroom, laundry etc) with water and bedding. Keep the animal in that room until the morning, when you can call the Foster Manager or SDCH at 8am.

If the animal starts becoming destructive, you can try adding treats or chews and calming music. It may take some time for the animal to relax.

Sydney Dogs and Cats Home - After Hours Veterinary Emergency Procedure (Please print this letter out to take to your After-Hours vet in an event of an emergency)

Dear Treating Veterinarian,

The animal presented to you is an animal from Sydney Dogs and Cats Home (SDCH), a charity shelter. The person caring for this animal is an SDCH volunteer foster carer who is caring for the animal in their home temporarily.

SDCH has our own veterinary staff and hospital facilities but does not have the capacity to provide afterhours care for our animals. Our foster carers are advised that if their foster animal requires emergency care that they should seek assistance from their nearest after-hours veterinary clinic. In the case of a minor issue that does not require emergency treatment, we ask that foster carers contact SDCH the following morning for treatment and advice.

As you can appreciate, SDCH functions with limited financial resources. In the case of an after-hours emergency we ask that you provide stabilisation and supportive care, with a view to handing over the case to the SDCH veterinarians the following morning.

We appreciate that in some cases euthanasia is the most humane outcome for an animal and we trust your judgement as to whether this is required immediately.

Please be advised that only SDCH management can authorise extensive or nonessential veterinary care as SDCH will be covering all costs incurred. Foster carers are not permitted to authorise nonessential care and SDCH will not cover nonessential costs authorised by foster carers. Any standard costs will be covered by SDCH.

Thank you for caring for our animal/s, we look forward to working with you in future
